

The Warren County Morris Canal Committee is pleased to announce the seasonal opening of the Jim and Mary Lee Museum, located on Route 519 in Stewartsville. The museum is located in a former Morris Canal plane tenders house. Visitors can walk the inclined plane, have a guided tour of the remains of the powerhouse, turbine chamber and tailrace and see canal artifacts on display in the museum and on the grounds.

The Morris Canal Museum at Bread Lock Park is open year-round and is located on Route 57 in New Village. The museum collection includes a scale model of a working lock, an interactive diorama, displays of Warren County history of the Morris Canal, Shippen Manor, Oxford Furnace and Lenape Indians, as well as the last boat to make the trip from Phillipsburg to Jersey City on the Morris Canal. The grounds include a full size replica of a Morris Canal boat, fitness and walking trails and a picnic area.

Both museums will be open the 2nd Sunday of the month from 1-4 except for major holidays when they are open on the third Sunday. Volunteers will be on hand to interpret the models and answer your questions. The Jim and Mary Lee Museum is open April to October and the Museum at Bread Lock Park is open year round.
